Annual Review of DAC Criteria

- Review indicators & methodology
- Assessing availability of new data
- Track DAC criteria with an eye to assessing outcomes and implementation
- Make recommendations to the working group

"The group will meet no less than annually to review the criteria and methods used to identify disadvantaged communities and may modify such methods to incorporate ne w data and scientific findings. The climate justice working group shall review identities of disadvantaged communities and modify such identities as needed."

(ECL § 75-0111(3))

Current Statutory Duties

CLCPA

- Consultation on a air toxics emissions reduction strategy by June 2024 On or before June first, two thousand twenty-four
- Consultation on updates to the Scoping Plan

Article 58, Title 7 of the ECL - Consultation with DEC on a study on the impacts of the Urban Heat Island Effect on DACs e impacts of the urban heat island effect on disadvantaged communities

Potential Legislation

- A964/S1292 amend the environmental conservation law to require the development of a clean fuel standard in New York State and would require the consultation of the CJWG and CAC with regards to the investment of funds.
- S5260 establishes an office of energy for equity to support local and communally developed climate
 projects to support disadvantaged communities, including by establishing and administering the
 community solutions fund and the solutions grants program. This legislation also and requires consultation
 with and reporting to the CJWG on the use of funds.
