The Climate Act is the nation's most ambitious climate change related legislation. The goal of the Climate Act is to reduce New York State's greenhouse gas emissions from all human activities a hundred percent by -- by -- or a hundred percent over nineteen ninety levels by 2050, with an incremental target of at least forty percent reduction in greenhouse gases by 2030. Importantly, at least eighty-five percent of those reductions must come from preventing the release of greenhouse gas emissions. Implementing the Climate Act will create opportunities to build a better future. ensure that this work also advances climate justice, the Climate Act mandates that at least between thirty-five to forty percent of the benefits of New York State spending on clean energy and energy

State agencies are also required to prioritize greenhouse gas emission and co-pollutant reductions in disadvantaged communities. For D.E.C., this includes drafting regulations to meet greenhouse gas emission limits required by the Climate Act.

Identification and prioritization of disadvantaged communities in accounting for the benefits of cutting pollution and improving resilience is what makes our Climate Act a transformative law.

To identify disadvantaged communities in New York, the Climate Justice Working Group was guided by the language of the Climate Act in identifying disproportionately burdened communities. They voted to include forty-five indicators using data on environmental hazards, climate change risk, public health, geography, and socioeconomic factors like race, income, education levels, unemployment rates, and housing conditions. Additionally, the draft disadvantaged communities designations are reflective of the climate justice working group, their lived experiences and the lived experiences of residents in these historically overburdened and underfunded communities.

Each census tract is scored based on their relative burden, risk, vulnerability or sensitivity, specifically, the percentile rates of the forty-five indicators for each census tract are combined to produce a value that measures a census -- a census tracts, relative level of environmental burdens and climate change risks, as well as population characteristics and health vulnerabilities relative to other tracks. The working group also voted to include low income households with -- with incomes at sixty percent of state median income as

We're calling on the state to help us do this by ensuring geographic equity with respect to the distribution of their investments. More than half of

We encourage state to evaluate areas with high concentrations of D.A.C.s and develop an approach to considering these areas when evaluating investments and benefits to programs and policies.

We also ask the criteria be reviewed to ensure that the communities that are most in need are prioritized and targeted for investment with transparent and current data guiding the decisions.

The Climate Leadership and Community

Protection Act empowers the State to prioritize the
safety and health of disadvantaged communities,
control potential regressive impacts of future
climate change mitigation and adaptation policies on
these communities, and prioritize allocation of
public investments in these areas.

Therefore, we recommend that the D.E.C. investment goal also apply investments in resiliency, not just investments in pollution, reduction, energy efficiency, and clean energy. During hurricane Ida, an IndoTrinidadian mother and her son drowned in their
basement apartment on 183rd Street in Hollis. In the
same storm, a Tibetan family of three, including a
two-year-old boy, drowned in another basement
apartment on 64th Street in Woodside.

And yet the cen -- census tracks for both of these blocks scored in the zero percentile for inland flooding risk areas, according to the state's model. Neither is considered disadvantaged.

Finally, the forty-five variables are insufficient in mismeasurements of community disadvantaged, including airport impact. Although located next to J.F.K., most census tracks in Brookfield, Laurelton, Rosedale and Springfield Gardens are not classified as disadvantaged. Barbara Brown, Chair of the Eastern Queens Alliance, says that all tracks near the airport should be included because of the constant air and noise pollution from
